To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to express the City of Bixby's appreciation for your continued safe operation of your fireworks sales business within our city limits, but also to apprise you of requirements for the City to enforce the more stringent regulations now imposed by the 2015 International Code Council (ICC) Fire Code, which was adopted by the City last year. In light of these updated regulations, the Bixby Fire Marshal's Office asks that all fireworks vendors familiarize themselves with these regulations, to ensure that they are always operating within the law. A copy of these requirements is included with this letter for your convenience. Following your review of these, we ask that you evaluate both your current operation and location to ensure that you meet all requirements of the Fire Code and the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal's Office.

Starting in calendar year 2014, we encourage all persons interested in selling fireworks next year have their applications turned in to the Bixby Fire Marshal's Office no later than May 1. We cannot ensure any applications turned in after May 1 will be processed through our permitting process in time to sell fireworks. Please ensure that you have all information needed with your permits upon submittal. We will not approve any applications if we do not have the following items:

APPLICATION PHASE

STEP 1: Obtain an application (See Attachment)

STEP 2: Select location for the retail fireworks stand

- Ensure the Fireworks Stand retail location is located in a commercially zoned area.
- It is the **responsibility** of the applicant to verify that your stand location is in an approved zoned area. Please do not accept the word of the property owner as to the correct zoning of the property. Re-zoning of property occurs often and your location may not be approved.
- Contact Planning Department to verify the current zoning of your selected location. You can reach the Planning Department at (918) 366-0430. Please advise the administrative staff that you need to verify property zoning.

STEP 3: Obtain property owner consent, if necessary

- If you are **NOT** the property owner of your selected location, written consent from the property owner will need to be obtained for your application.

STEP 4: Prepare a site diagram to be submitted with your application. All of the following information is required to be on the site diagram (See Site Diagram Example). Omission of required information may delay your application process or prevent your application from being approved.

- Name of the retail stand
- Address of the stand location
- Compass direction
- Public roadways surrounding or adjacent to the property

- Names of public roadways
- Location and name of any building located on the property
- Location of retail fireworks stand on the property
- Size of the temporary structure (tent) being used
- Distance between the stand and any existing buildings on the property
- Vehicle access and parking areas
- Location and type of portable fire extinguishers
- Means of egress

STEP 5: Obtain a photocopy of the “Certificate of Flame Resistance” of the tent being used.

- The “Certificate of Flame Resistance” will need to be obtained from the company that you rent your tent from.
- Only tents provided by a commercial rental company will be approved for use as a retail fireworks stand, providing that the tent has a “Certificate of Flame Resistance”
 1. **Tents or canopies purchased at retail stores such as: Discount stores, sporting goods stores, department stores, home improvement stores, etc., will not be allowed for use.**

STEP 6: Application Deadline: 5:00 pm, May 1st.

We cannot ensure applications submitted after the deadline date will be approved through our permitting process in time to sale fireworks during the season. (NOTE: If May 1st falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the deadline will be the first business day following the weekend)

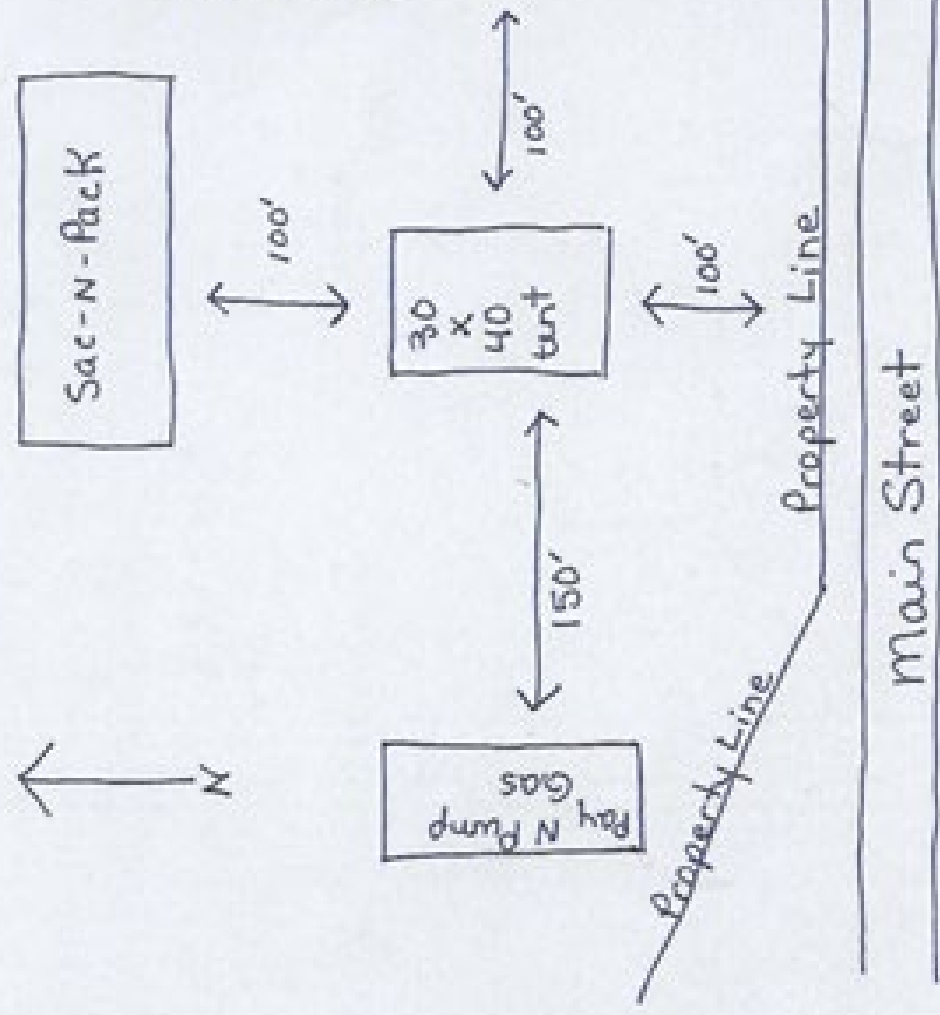

REQUIRES PERMIT

TO OBTAIN A PERMIT FOR THE TEMPORARY USE OF A TENT THAT EXCEEDS 120 SQUARE FEET IN AREA FOR THE GATHERING OF 10 OR MORE PERSONS REQUIRES THE FOLLOWING:

1. Complete an application for the Temporary Use of a Tent.
2. Provide a detailed site that includes the following:
 - A) Site plan (tent location must be at least 30 feet from a permanent structure.
 - B) Seating capacity & arrangement.
 - C) Total number of occupants.
 - D) Means of egress.
 - E) Location and type of all electrical, heating and cooking equipment.
3. All electrical spot lighting shall be a minimum of 6 feet from fabric or combustibles or protected with non-combustible insulation.
4. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a 2A rating (2 ½ gallon water pressurized) shall be provided if no electrical is used or a minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a 4A:60BC rating (10 pound multi-purpose dry chemical) shall be provided if electrical equipment is used.
5. An affidavit or affirmation from the person or company providing the tent attesting to the following information relative to the flame resistance of the fabric:
 - A) Name & Address of the structure owner.
 - B) Date the fabric was last tested.
 - C) Trade name or kind of chemical used.
 - D) Name of testing agency.
 - E) List test standard used for testing.
6. Open-flame cooking devices shall be a minimum of 20 feet from tent structure.

IF TENT EXCEEDS 900 SQUARE FEET IN AREA THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE ITEMS APPLIES.

7. Structure shall have been maintenance inspected within the last three months. Provide a copy of maintenance inspection.
8. Tent fabric shall have no un-repaired damage.
9. If structure is to be used as an Assembly type occupancy it shall be free from all combustibles and any combustibles, including dried vegetation that may create a fire hazard shall be a minimum of 20 feet from structure.
10. The minimum fire extinguisher requirements referenced by Item #3 shall be increased to a minimum of two extinguishers.

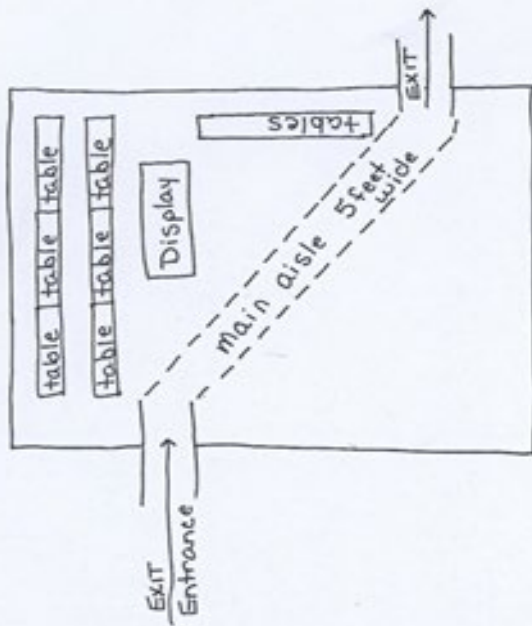
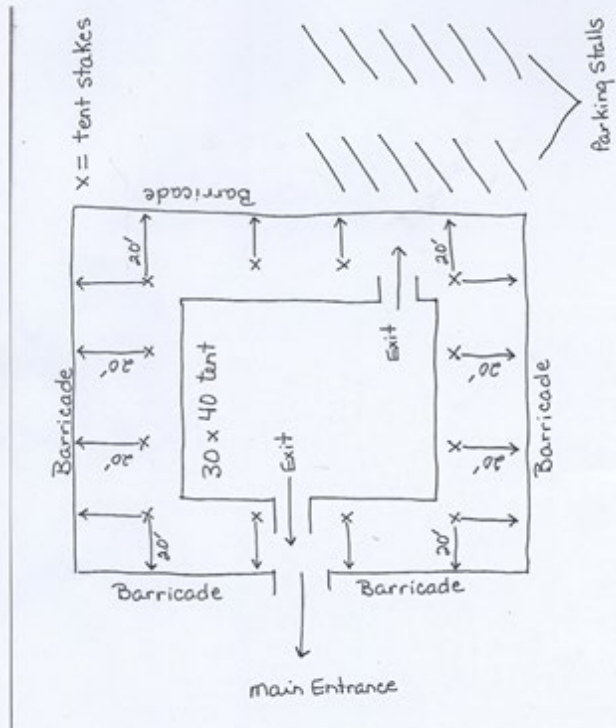

REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSUMER FIREWORKS RETAIL SALES FACILITIES

The following are the minimum requirements mandated through Oklahoma Statute Title 68, Article 16 Section 1621-1634 and the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal Commission rules established in accordance with O.S. Title 68§1633, for any facility selling consumer fireworks commonly referred to as Class “C:” Counties, cities or towns may impose more stringent criteria to include prohibiting the sale and use of fireworks within its corporate limits.

The sale of fireworks is only authorized between June 15 and July 6 from December 15th through January 2 per O.S. 68§1623(a).

General Operational Requirements:

1. Retail license must be posted and visible in sales area. Address must be the physical address of the facility. **[O.S. 68§1627(a)]**
2. A responsible person of sixteen (16) years of age or older must be in charge of the stand. **[O.S. 68§1623(d)]**
3. A sales clerk must be on duty to serve the customer at time of purchase. **[OS. 68§1623(b)]**
4. Signs stating “**FIREWORKS – NO SMOKING WITHIN 50 FEET**” must be posted on all sides of the entire facility. **[O.S. 68§1623(a) & NFPA 1124 Para, 7.3.11.1]**
5. All fireworks must be invoiced from a distributor, wholesaler or other retailer licensed by the State Tax Commission to do business in Oklahoma. **[O.S. 68§1627(a)]**
6. Records shall be maintained on available inventory and shall be made available to the authority having jurisdiction upon request. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.24.1 & 7.3.24.2]**
7. Prohibited fireworks: Bottle rockets, stick rockets, cherry bombs, M-80’s or any combination thereof or any fireworks not properly labeled as: Division 1.4, UN0336 or Class “C.” Any prohibited fireworks found can and will be confiscated and turned over to the county Sheriff. **[O.S. 68§1624(a) & (b)]**

8. It is illegal to offer, or to sell fireworks to children under the age of twelve (12) years, unless accompanied by an adult. **[O.S. 68§1627(b)]**

9. A retail sale location inside a structure (building) must comply with all the requirements of the *International Building Code* (IBC), 2006 edition, *International Fire code* (IFC), 2006 edition and the National Fire Protection Association Standard NFPA 1124 *Code for the Manufacture, Transportation, Storage, and Retail Sales of Fireworks and Pyrotechnic Articles*, 2003 edition and be approved in writing by the State Fire Marshal. **[O.S. 68§162399(c)]**

10. Tents, canopies, or temporary membrane structures must have a flame resistance meeting the requirements of NFPA701, *Standard Methods of Fire Tests for Flame-Resistant Textiles and Films*. A certificate or other evidence of approval by a recognized laboratory must be available for inspection authorities to verify the materials meet the required flame resistance. **NFPA 1124-7, 3, 5 & NFPA 102 – 8.4.1 thru 8.4.3]**

11. Customers cannot be under any part of tents, canopies or other membrane structure. **[O.S. 68§1623(c)]**

Fire Extinguishers:

12. Every retail sales facility must have a minimum of one (1) portable fire extinguisher with a minimum 2A/IBC rating. If the facility exceeds 200 square feet two (2) portable fire extinguishers are required with at least one being a multi-purpose dry chemical type. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.8]**

13. In temporary fireworks retail sales facilities, the travel distance to any fire extinguisher cannot exceed 35 feet travel distance. In permanent fireworks retail sales facilities the travel distance to any fire extinguisher cannot exceed 75 feet travel distance. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.4.5.2]**

Separation/Area Requirements:

14. Consumer fireworks retail sales facilities shall not be located within 50 feet of the following: motor vehicle fuel-dispensing station dispensers; retail propane-dispensing station dispensers; aboveground storage tanks for flammable or combustible liquids, flammable gas, or flammable liquefied gas; and compressed natural gas dispensing facilities. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.12.1]**

15. Fireworks retail and storage areas shall be not located within 300 feet of any aboveground bulk storage or bulk dispensing areas for flammable or combustible liquids, flammable gas, and flammable liquid gas. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.12.6]**

16. Temporary fireworks retail sales facilities cannot be any closer than 30 feet from any other building, combustibles, tents or fireworks storage areas. **NFPA 1124 – Table 7.4 & IFC Table 3304.5.2 (3)**
17. Temporary fireworks retail sales facilities with an excess of 50 lbs of 1.4 explosives cannot be any closer than 100 feet from any public railroad or highway and upon highways, sidewalks, and public property or in assembly on educational occupancies. “50-pounds Net Explosive Weight” **[IFC 3301.2.1 & Table 3304.5.2 (3)]**
18. Vehicle parking cannot be within 10 feet of a temporary fireworks retail sales facility or fireworks storage facility. **[NFPA 7.4.6.2]**

Heating Appliances

19. Temporary heating sources shall be listed and used in accordance with their listing. These heating sources must also have a tip-over and temperature-overheated protection. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.17.1 & 7.3.17.2]**
20. Open-flame and exposed-element heating devices shall be prohibited. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.17.3]**

Portable Generators:

21. Portable generators and storage of excess fuel must be at least 20 feet from the fireworks retail sales facility and storage areas. **[NFPA 7.3.18.1 & 2]**

Cooking Equipment:

22. Cooking equipment of any type shall not be permitted within 20 feet of tents, canopies, or membrane structures used for the storage or sale of consumer fireworks. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.4.9.3.1]**
23. Open flame cooking equipment of any type shall not be allowed within 50 feet of tents, canopies, or membrane structures used for the storage or sale of consumer fireworks. **[NFPA – 7.4.9.3.1 & 2]**

Housekeeping:

24. The area located within 30 feet of a consumer fireworks retail sales facility shall be kept free of accumulated dry grass, dry brush, and combustible debris. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.4.6.1]**
25. Consumer fireworks retail sales and storage areas shall be kept free of accumulation of debris and rubbish at all times. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.21.1]**
26. Vacuum cleaners or other mechanical cleaning devices shall not be used. Brooms, brushes, dustpans used to sweep up loose powder or dust shall be made of non-sparking materials. **[NFPA 1124 7.3.21.3 & 4]**

27. Consumer fireworks devices that are damaged shall be removed and not offered for sale. Devices that are damaged shall be returned to the dealer or shall be disposed of properly. **NFPA 1124 – 7.3.21.5 & 6]**

Electrical:

28. All electrical wiring shall be in accordance with NFPA 70, *National Electric Code* (NEC) **[NFPA 1124 – 7.3.16]**
29. Battery powered equipment, electrical equipment, and electrical cords that are used in conjunction with a consumer fireworks retail sales facility area shall be listed and shall be used in accordance with their listing. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.4.9.1]**
30. Temporary wiring installed in a temporary structure including tents and canopies shall comply with Article 305 of NFPA 70, *National Electric Code*. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.4.9.1.1]**
31. Where temporary electrical conductors are placed on top of an outdoor surface to connect the permanent power source to the temporary consumer fireworks retail sales facility's temporary electrical system, the conductors shall be provided with physical protection against damage caused by pedestrian or vehicular traffic. **[NFPA 1124 – 7.11.1.3]**
32. As feeder line to fireworks stand are required to be protected the use of **UF** cable or **SO** cord is permitted. The **SO** cable can be laid on the ground if no foot or vehicle traffic will come in contact. **[NEC]**
33. The use of keyless or any other light fixture will not be permitted directly over or within two (2) feet of a line drawn vertically from the front edge of the fireworks stock without an approved protective cover over the light bulb. **[NEC]**
34. All electrical power supply must be properly grounded. A grounding rod is mandatory if a construction type pole is used to supply power. **[NEC]**

City of Bixby

Fireworks Permits for Sale and Display.

FAQ'S

1) Q- Can I display fireworks in the City of Bixby?

A- Yes, Purchase a permit to display fireworks from the City of Bixby or a licensed vendor at a cost of \$20.00

2) Q- What conditions must I meet in order to receive a permit?

A- Such fireworks must be discharged on a non-combustible surface of sufficient size to contain the entire ground portion of the display and not closer than 25 feet to any permanent structure.

B- The adult person shall obtain a permit from the City of Bixby or from a licensed fireworks vendor at a cost of \$20.00, said permit identifying the adult in charge of this use by name and address, and also identifying the proposed location on or near the permit holder's property.

C- The adult permit holder in charge of the use must be physically present for any household member to use the fireworks and within 100 feet of the point of display, and have the permit posted in a place of prominence during the discharge of the fireworks for examination by any law enforcement officer.

D- The permit holder is further responsible for the cleaning up of any debris caused by any person discharging fireworks under the permit holder.

3) Q- Can I display fireworks in the City Parks?

A- Private persons may not use or discharge fireworks within any city or county park, nor on any highway, turnpike or any street that has paving in Excess of 26 feet wide.

4) Q-Do I have to be present while my child buys or discharges fireworks?

A- The possession or the sale of any fireworks to or by any individual under the age of 12 years shall be unlawful within the city, unless under the immediate and direct supervision of a parent, guardian, or other responsible adult in possession of a current permit.

5) Q-What are the conditions to be met to obtain a permit for sale of fireworks?

A- The vendor at each location must obtain an annual license from the city at a cost of \$750.00 and must also provide a copy of the state sales tax permit.

- B- The property has direct access on an arterial street and adequate on-site parking so that the operation of the stand can be conducted without the interference with travel on the paved surface of the artery.
- C- Only Class 1.4G fireworks, as defined by the United States Department of Transportation, are sold on the premises.
- D- The “Season” for fireworks sales shall be limited to be only from June 15th until July 4th of each year.
- E- The vendor shall post and distribute a “Notice of Bixby Fireworks Ordinance” to each purchase of fireworks, said notice to be provided by the city.
- F- Owner or vendor shall maintain liability insurance on each location.

6) Q- Can I have a public display?

- A- Supervised public displays shall be permitted with a permit and compliance to requirements of the BIXBY FIRE DEPARTMENT and National Fire Protection Act (NFPA) 1123. The use of fireworks before a proximate audience (as defined by the NFPA) shall be permitted with a fireworks permit and compliance to NFPA 1126. Permits may be obtained from the city or a licensed fireworks vendor at a cost of \$100.00. The permit fee may be waived, upon written request by the city manager, fire chief, or his designee. Permits must be available for inspection by the city at all times during the display, including the setup and tear down of the launch site and staging area.

7) Q- What are the steps for submitting a request to discharge fireworks for a public display?

- A- Read ordinance 5-5E-4
- B- Complete an application
- C- Provide copy of Pyrotechnic License and/or certification
- D- Insurance Required: The applicant desiring to discharge fireworks or endeavor in fireworks displays with the city must, in addition to providing proof of such licensing and/or certification, as referred to herein, must also provide proof of insurance indemnifying and holding harmless the city, in an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00): and further providing proof of liability insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00).
- E- Contact the Fire Marshal’s office (918)366-0436 to review application and gain signature approval for the activity.
- F- Once Fire Marshal approval is gained, complete and submit a citizen’s agenda request form to go on the agenda for city council’s approval. (Form available through the City receptionist.)
- G- The agenda request form must be turned in by noon the Wednesday before each scheduled council meeting. (Council meetings are the 2nd and 4th Monday of each Month.)
- H- Once the Council approves the application, a permit will be issued.

Fines for Violation:

- 1) Any sale or use of fireworks in violation of this section shall be punished by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
- 2) Any use of fireworks between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. shall be punished, upon conviction, by a fine that is double the fine normally imposed for a violation of this section.
- 3) Possession of any fireworks other than allowed by this section shall be punished by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
- 4) Failure to remove debris caused by any person discharging fireworks under the permit holder shall be punishable by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
- 5) Any fireworks used during red flag alert, burn ban for the area encompassing the city of Bixby, or emergency period declared by the mayor or fire chief, as set forth in subsection D of this section, shall be punished by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.

City of Bixby Ordinance

5-5E-4: FIREWORKS:

A. Permit Required: It is unlawful to manufacture, sell, furnish, possess, display, or use any fireworks within the city unless the appropriate fireworks permit is obtained.

B. Regulations:

1. The use of class 1.4G fireworks by individuals shall be permitted only under permit as described in this subsection B and subsection C of this section.
2. "Permissible fireworks" shall mean composition or device for the purpose of producing a visible or an audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation, and which is defined as common or special fireworks by the United States department of transportation (DOT). Fireworks are further classified in this law as class 1.3G or class 1.4G. The term "fireworks" shall not include toy cap pistols and caps, blank cartridges, railroad flares and model rockets.
 - a. "Class 1.4G fireworks" (DOT common fireworks) shall mean any devices suitable for use by the public that conform to requirements of the United States consumer products safety commission (CPSC) and are designed primarily to produce visible effects by combustion, and some small devices designed to produce an audible effect.
 - b. "Class 1.3G display fireworks" (ODOT special fireworks) shall mean any devices suitable for use by the public that conform to requirements of the United States consumer products safety commission (CPSC) and are designed primarily to produce visible effects by combustion, and some small devices designed to produce an audible effect.
3. Persons within the city limits may use or otherwise discharge permissible fireworks only from three o'clock (3:00) P.M. to eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. on dates approved by the city manager, fire chief or his designee, provided the following conditions are met. The city manager and/or fire chief will post the approved dates each year at city hall.
 - a. Such fireworks must be discharged on a noncombustible surface of sufficient size to contain the entire ground portion of the display and not closer than twenty five feet (25') to any permanent structure.
 - b. The adult person shall obtain a permit from the city or from a licensed fireworks vendor at a cost of twenty dollars (\$20.00), said permit identifying the adult in charge of this use by name and address, and also identifying the proposed location on or near the permit holder's property. Applications for said permits shall be made available during normal business hours from April 1 through July 3 of any given year and permits are valid only for the year of issuance.
 - c. The adult permit holder in charge of the use must be physically present for any household member to use the fireworks and within one hundred feet (100') of the point of display, and have the permit

posted in a place of prominence during the discharge of the fireworks for examination by any law enforcement officer. The permit holder is further responsible for the examination by any law enforcement officer. The permit holder is further responsible for the cleaning up of any debris caused by any person discharging fireworks under the permit holder.

- d. Private persons may not use or discharge fireworks within any city or county park, nor on any highway, turnpike or any street that has paving in excess of twenty six feet (26') wide, such as an arterial street, or collector street.
4. The possession or the sale of any fireworks to or by any individual under the age of twelve (12) years shall be unlawful within the city, unless under the immediate and direct supervision of a parent, guardian, or other responsible adult in possession of a current permit.

C. License To Sell Or Display For Sale: The sale or display for sale of fireworks shall be unlawful within the city as set forth in subsection A of this section. A license for the sale or display for sale of fireworks shall be considered where the following conditions are met:

1. The vendor at each location must obtain an annual license from the city at a cost of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) and must also provide a copy of the state sales tax permit.
2. The property has direct access on an arterial street and adequate on site parking so that the operation of the stand can be conducted without interference with travel on the paved surface of the artery.
3. Only class 1.4G fireworks, as defined by the United States department of transportation, are sold on the premises.
4. The "season" for fireworks sales shall be limited to be only from June 15 until July 4 of each year.
5. The vendor shall post and distribute a "Notice Of Bixby Fireworks Ordinance" to each purchase of fireworks, said notice to be provided by the city.
6. Owner or vendor shall maintain liability insurance on each location.
7. There have been no significant accidents reported to the city from previous operations at the stand at that location.
8. Supervised public displays shall be permitted with a permit and compliance to requirements of the Bixby fire department and national fire protection act (NFPA) 1123. The use of fireworks before a proximate audience (as defined by the NFPA) shall be permitted with a fireworks permit and compliance to NFPA 1126. Permits may be obtained from the city or a licensed fireworks vendor at a cost of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). The permit fee may be waived, upon written request by the city manager, fire chief or his designee. Permits must be available for inspection by the city at all times during the display, including the setup and tear down of the launch site and staging area.

D. Emergency Suspension: In the event that the governor of the state of Oklahoma calls a red flag fire alert or burn ban for the area encompassing the city of Bixby and/or the city of Bixby fire

department determines that the city of Bixby is in fire danger due to the weather conditions. The mayor or the fire chief of the city may declare an emergency and cause the use of fireworks to be terminated and declare them to be illegal during the emergency period.

E. Fines For Violation:

1. Any sale or use of fireworks in violation of this section shall be punished by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
2. Any use of fireworks between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. shall be punished, upon conviction, by a fine that is double the fine normally imposed for a violation of this section.
3. Possession of any fireworks other than allowed by this section shall be punished by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
4. Failure to remove debris caused by any person discharging fireworks under the permit holder shall be punishable by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
5. Any fireworks used during a red flag fire alert, burn ban for the area encompassing the city of Bixby, or emergency period declared by the mayor or fire chief, as set forth in subsection D of this section, shall be punished by a fine of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) plus costs.
